John 14:14 "If ye shall ask anything in My name, I will do it."


- o Pray for Steve & Deb as they lead this ministry in the way God shows them to go.

Founder's Corner

Well, this newsletter has been waiting about 2 weeks on me...l'm usually not at a loss for words or lacking in ideas, but I just didn't know what to write about!! John suggested I tell you about my favorite event of this ministry. I have a lot of favorite events, but my most favorite is welcoming people home. We usually don't sleep much the night before...remember when you were a child, and it was Christmas Eve? It's a lot like that! We anticipate homecoming very much and it is extremely exciting for me!

Welcome home day starts quite early. It starts as soon as we send the acceptance documents. His picture goes on my desk and I start praying for him. I pray that he will not stress out, that he will continue to make the most of his time, that he will enjoy his friends and make more memories with them, that he will trust that God has got the next chapter of his life (as He has had every other chapter) and that he will be aware of God's continued grace and plans. I pray for his peace and joy. I fall deeply in love with my new son and can't wait for him to come home. Yep! All true...sounds rather mushy and embarrassing, but I'm trying to be transparent.

On the evening before release day, I continue to pray for him — mostly for peace at that time. On the morning of release, we get up early. I usually work for a few hours and continue to pray. When the Lord prompts me, we all pile into one or more of the cars and head to where he will be dropped off. Usually, we wait only a few moments before he arrives, but sometimes it's hours. I continue to pray for his safety and that he will not be afraid. Then the exciting moment arrives...a white van drives slowly into the parking lot and my new son appears!! Can't you just feel the excitement? Then a genuine "WHOO HOO" is shouted by someone who is usually embarrassed to have made so much noise — but who can stop that kind of response?

Then I get to hug him!! He is finally more than a picture and emails... He leaves us for a short time to be processed by which ever organization is going to help him settle into society (probation or parole). When he come back, we all pile back into the car(s) and head for Fillmore house.

At Fillmore, Steve has carefully purchased first day clothing and our new son selects what he wants to wear for the first day. It is always great to see the transformation! We relax for a bit while he checks out his new space and visits with friends he hasn't seen in a while (sons that were released before he was). Then he tells us (if I haven't found out before then) where he would like to dine for his first meal out. We pile back into the cars (usually by that time too many brothers are there for one car) and head to the restaurant of his choosing. It is ALWAYS exciting to watch the first meal of non-prison food and fellowship with brothers. I really enjoy his enjoyment! After our meal, we usually head home. That is usually a bit more than most sons can enjoy, so we go home and rest. He settles into his room and visits with his new family.

That's my favorite event in a nutshell...

Thoughts from an Eagles' Nest Resident

Proverbs 12:15 "The way of a fool is right in his own eyes: but he that hearkeneth unto counsel is wise."

It is quite different out here than in there, as you already know, but many of the things you hear from others in there are not quite the whole truth. We are all adjusting in our own time and in our own way. Things are not terrible, like so many in there want you to believe. Most of them want you to be as miserable as they are, since they came back due to more bad choices. Don't listen to that garbage. Yes, there are bumps in the road, but every person alive run into bumps in life, there is no avoiding that.

Here are a few things to think about:

- 1. Some here when they got out got permission for the web and smart phones immediately.
- 2. All are getting permission to go to our church each week
- 3. Most P.O.'s (Probation/Parole Officers) are being understanding and working with us as best they are able. SO's (Surveillance Officers) are not down your throat all the time and in fact in several cases they have been very helpful. There are always exceptions, but we feel thing are changing for the better). In this writer's case there have been way more yes answers than no answers when I ask for permissions from my probation team. The transition has been quite easily handled with many helpful people around. I feel you just must make up your mind to do what is right and then make good choices whether big or small.
- 4. When it comes to treatment, one Eagle who was dreading treatment because of a previous bad experience inside, now has no problem going to group and in fact sometimes enjoys it.
- 5. There are more places we are allowed to go than there are places where we are not allowed to go.
- 6. Real food is great!!!!! Yes, we can go to most restaurants.
- 7. Driving is an adventure that is fun again, just like it was when you first got you license.
- 8. There are resources and services in every county in the state to help when needed.
- 9. All the things you need to do, when you first get out, have been done by others before you, who will help and guide you to make things easy. Usually, 2 days and they are done. As I'm told they say in Australia, "No worries mate!"
- 10. Dreaming is a good thing to do, remember the Lord wishes you the desires of your heart. So, what are they?
 - a. Who do you want to see 1st?
 - b. What do you want for your 1st meal?
 - c. In your county, what would you like to see again?
- 11. There are people out here who will help you, guide you and pray for and with you. What else do you need? So, get ready to make things happen when we see you.

I know this may seem hard to believe because there is so much negative on the yard, but it is true. Life can be enjoyable for us registered citizens; it is all up to us. I look forward to you coming out and enjoying your life, as I am enjoying mine with, the Lord. Remember, "Your Attitude will determine your Altitude!" Zig Ziglar
