I need for all to know, those coming home to the nest and those coming home somewhere else, it is not an easy path. You will be highly challenged. You will need to work VERY hard. You will need to continue to center your very being in Christ. You will need to rely heavily on Him! Let there be no doubt. Even while leaning on Christ, you will still be challenged. You will need perseverance; your faith will be challenged.

You will succeed, but it is not easy. Success will only come through relying on Christ, perseverance and hard work. There are many distractions. There are many trials. There are many restrictions.

In cut and dry terms. She's a mother, a caretaker, a daughter of the Most High God, she's an eagle soaring high, she's only 25 (as we all are here every year), and although this shows someone you have gotten to know, many will be surprised, shocked even, to learn that she is also a *Survivor*.

That ringing word we have all come to know. A word so significant that it slips us away from this moment and into another, a time when our actions were clouded in darkness, when we as saints were not living in the Name of our Maker. A word that reminds us of the hurt we've caused. Of a hurt that we ourselves have suffered.

Deb Schmidt is a survivor but instead of letting that word define her. Instead of letting her pain root within her identity, she was called to do something that continues to astound me daily. She decided to obey our Lord and open her doors and her heart and her whole self to people who've created survivors. She chose to love us. She chose to live with us. And beyond it all, she chose to accept us. Not for our past, or our hurts, or anything that we did - but solely because she was told to love and love she does.
